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GLOBALIZATION PROCESSES IMPACT ON FOREIGN LANGUAGES STUDY AT UKRAINIAN UNIVERSITIES

The globalization process is understood as social progress in the course of which the state borders of individual countries are eroded and gradually erased. And the population of these countries is aware of the necessity and inevitability of globalization process.

The objective reality for Ukraine is the development of international relations, international cooperation, joining the single European educational and scientific space. Trends of modern educational space are aimed at the development of a person capable of using the acquired knowledge. The degree of this development is an indicator of the country's progress, an indicator of its competitiveness in globalized socio-economic relations [1].
